

L-1 Visa Process

Siskind Susser verifies with employer that employee meets the L-1 requirements including

- 1) the employee has worked for one of the last three years continuously for the company;
- 2) that the work was performed overseas for the company; and
- 3) that the employee is coming as an executive, manager, or specialized knowledge employee

Client completes L-1 Questionnaire form and provides to Siskind Susser and Client gathers documents on the Siskind Susser L-1 document checklist

Siskind Susser will submit the petition package to the BCIS regional service center with jurisdiction over the Client's locality

Siskind Susser prepares the L-1 petition package and sends Client's application documents for signature including I-129, I-129 L Supplement, G-28 and I-129S form for a blanket L petition

BCIS approves case and cables approval to designated consulate or requests additional evidence.

If BCIS requests additional evidence, then Siskind Susser will prepare response; if case approved, BCIS will cable approval to designated consulate

If employee is in the US and change of status requested, employee can begin work (employee must apply for visa at consulate on first trip abroad); if employee outside the US, employee must request visa at a US consulate

If employee outside US, Consulate will issue visa and employee enters on L-1 status
